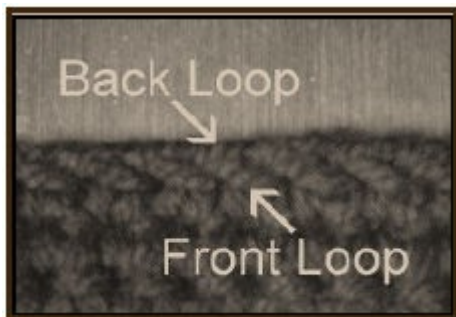
Single Crochet Decrease - Insert hook into next st, YO, draw up a loop, insert hook into next st, YO, draw up a loop, YO, draw through remaining loops on hook

Double Crochet Decrease - YO, insert hook into next stitch, YO, draw up a loop, YO, draw hook through two of the loops on hook, YO, insert hook into next stitch, YO, draw up a loop, YO, draw hook through two of the loops on hook, YO, draw through remaining loops on hook

Markers - Markers are used to specify where a round begins and ends. Use a small piece of contrasting yarn or a small safety pin placed in the stitch before the first stitch of each round. Move

the marker as you go.

Back or Front Loop Only - Work only in stitches marked by arrows below:



MATERIAL LIST

Worsted Weight Yarn in the Following:

Pink - 5 ounces

White - 3 ounces

Blue - 3 ounces

Crochet hook Size G

Tapestry needle

12 mm animal eyes

1 Pair doll wire rim doll glasses

BODY

Warning: Choking hazard due to small parts. If you are making this item for a child under the age of 3 years please embroider facial features and eliminate the glasses.

Rnd 1) With Pink yarn, ch 2, work 6 sc in second ch from hook, join to first sc with a sl st, **DO NOT TURN** (6 sc)

Rnd 2) 2 sc in next sc and in each sc around (12 sc)

Rnd 3) 2 sc in each sc around (24 sc)

Rnd 4) *sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around (36 sc)

Rnd 5-6) Sc in each sc around (36 sc)

Rnd 7) *sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around (54 sc)

Rnd 8) sc in each sc around (54 sc)

Rnd 9) *sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around (72 sc)

Rnd 10) working in BLO sc around (72 sc)

Rnd 11) sc in each sc around (72 sc)

Rnd 12) *sc in next 4 sc, dec; repeat from * around (60 sc)

Rnd 13-40) sc in each sc around (60 sc)

Rnd 41) *sc in next sc, dec; repeat from * around (40 sc)

Rnd 42) *sc in next 2 sc, dec; repeat from * around (30 sc)

NECK

Rnd 43) *sc in next sc, dec; repeat from * around (20 sc)

Rnd 44) sc in each sc around (20 sc) firmly stuff body

HEAD

Rnd 45) *sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around (30 sc)
Rnd 46) *sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around (40 sc)
Rnd 47) *sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around (50 sc)
Rnd 48) *sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around (60 sc)
Rnd 49-62) sc in each sc around (60 sc) NOTE: Insert eyes between rows 57 and 58 leaving 5 sc between each eye
Rnd 63) *sc in next sc, dec; repeat from * around (40 sc)
Rnd 64) *sc in next 2 sc, dec; repeat from * around (30 sc)
Rnd 65) *sc in next sc, dec; repeat from * around, firmly stuff neck and head
Rnd 66) Dec around (10 sc) stuff more if necessary
Rnd 67) Dec around (5 sc); finish off leaving a long length for sewing; sew top of head closed; secure ends; clip end

ARMS (make 2)

Rnd 1) With Pink yarn, ch 2, 6 sc in second ch from hook; join to first sc with sl st (6 sc)
Rnd 2) 2 sc in each sc around (12 sc)
Rnd 3) sc in each sc around (12 sc)
Rnd 4) *sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around (18 sc)
Rnd 5-6) sc in each sc around (18 sc)
Rnd 7) *sc in next 4sc, dec; repeat from * around (15 sc)
Rnd 8) *sc in next 3 sc, dec; repeat from * around (12 sc)
Rnd 9) *sc in next 2 sc, dec; repeat from * around (9 sc)
Rnd 10) 2 sc in each sc around (18 sc)
Rnd 11-23) sc in each sc around (18 sc)
Rnd 24-25) sc in next 9 sts, sl st in next 9 sts
Rnd 26) sc in next 9 sts, sl st in next st; finish off leaving a long length for sewing, stuff firmly; attach to sides of body using photograph as a reference

EARS (make 2)

Row 1) With Pink yarn, ch 10, sc in second ch from hook and in each ch across; ch 1 turn (9 sc)
Row 2) sc in each sc across, ch 1 turn (9 sc)
Row 3) sc in each sc across, DO NOT CH, turn (9 sc)
Row 4) dec, sc in next 5 sc, dec, turn (7 sc)
Row 5) dec, sc in next 3 sc, dec, turn (5 sc)
Row 6) dec, sc in next sc, dec, turn (3 sc)
Row 7) dec, sc in next sc, turn (2 sc)
Row 8) dec (1 sc); turn; sl st evenly along all 3 edges of ear; finish off leaving a long length for sewing; attach to head using photograph as a reference; ears should naturally curve forward, if they don't form them to slightly curl and lay flat forward

SNOUT

Rnd 1) With Pink yarn, ch 2, 6 sc in second ch from hook, join with a sl st to first sc, DO NOT TURN (6 sc)
Rnd 2) 2 sc in each sc around (12 sc)
Rnd 3) *sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around (18 sc)
Rnd 4) *sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around (24 sc)
Rnd 5) in BLO sc around (24 sc)

Rnd 6-7) sc around, sl st in next sc; finish off leaving a long length for sewing, lightly stuff and sew to head using photograph as a reference, embroider nostril and mouth details on snout using photograph as a reference

HAT

Rnd 1) With Blue yarn, ch 2, 6 sc in second ch from hook, join to first with sl st, DO NOT TURN

Rnd 2) 2 sc in each sc around (12 sc)

Rnd 3) *sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around (18 sc)

Rnd 4) *sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around (24 sc)

Rnd 5) *sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around (30 sc)

Rnd 6) *sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around (36 sc)

Rnd 7) *sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around (42 sc)

Rnd 8) *sc in next 6 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around (48 sc)

Rnd 9) in BLO, sc around (48 sc)

Rnd 10-12) sc in each sc around (48 sc)

Rnd 13) In FLO, sc around (48 sc)

Rnd 14) 2 sc in each sc around (96 sc)

Rnd 15) sc in each sc around (96 sc)

Rnd 16) sc in each sc around, sl st in next sc, finish off, weave in loose ends. Attach to head.

DRESS

Skirt

Row 1) With White yarn, ch 48, dc in third ch from hook and in each remaining ch across; ch 3 turn (47 dc)

Row 2) 2 dc in each dc across; ch 3 turn (94 dc)

Row 3-11) dc in each dc across; ch 3 turn (94 dc)

Row 12) dc in each dc across to last; yo; ins hook into last dc; yo; draw through once; yo; draw though 2 loops on hook (2 loops remain on hook at this point); wrap new color on hook; yo; draw through last 2 loops on hook (color change made); ch 1 turn

Row 13) sc in eac dc across; finish off; weave in loose ends.

Bib

Row 1) With Blue yarn and working in free loops of foundation row, join yarn in 15th free loop with a sl st, ch 3, dc in next 18 loops, ch 3 turn (19 dc)

Row 2-6) Dc in each dc across, ch 3 turn (19 dc)

Row 7) First shoulder strap: Dc in next 2 dc, ch 3 turn (3 dc)

Row 8-15) Dc in each dc across, ch 3 turn (3 dc)

Row 16) Dc in each dc across, finish off leaving an 18" length for sewing

Second shoulder strap:

Row 1) With Blue yarn, join with a sl st in the 3rd dc from end of bib, ch 3, dc in next 2 dc, ch 3 turn (3 dc)

Row 2-9) Dc in each dc across, ch 3 turn (3 dc)

Row 10) Dc in each dc across, finish off leaving an 18" length for sewing

Pockets (make 2)

Row 1) With Blue yarn, ch 11, sc in second chain from hook and in each ch across, ch 1 turn (10 sc)

Row 2-5) Sc in each sc across, ch 1 turn (10 sc)

Row 6) Sc in each sc across, do not ch, turn (10 sc)

Row 7) Dec, sc in next 6 sc, dec, turn (8 sc)

Row 8) Dec, sc in next 4 sc, dec, turn (6 sc), finish off leaving a long length for sewing.

Dress Finishing

With White yarn fold dress in half to match back skirt seams. Using tapestry needle sew back seam closed. Sew shoulder straps to top of back of skirt, do not criss cross. Sew pockets to front of skirt using photograph as a reference.
