Project Name: Targaryen Dragon Scale Bikini Top

*Nothing goes together quite like crafting and a good movie/ tv program; It's the coffee and cigarettes of the DIY world, and so it's not at all surprising how many patterns are influence by the medium. This is my homage to a show that has recently grasped the nation's attention. Of course it's also a book, however, it's way too hard to hold a book and crochet at the same time.*

*Wear it with a cute pair of daisy-dukes this summer, and people will stop and stare at you as though you had little baby dragons crawling all over your shoulders.*

Yarn Name- Jewel

Yarn Manufacturer- Feza Yarns

Yarn Fiber Content- 100% Acrylic with metallic thread

Yarn Colour Name/ Number- white- #103

Weight (in ounces and grams) of the skein/ball- 3.53 ounces; 100 grams

Length (in yards and meters) of the skein ball- 275 yards; 251 metres

Hook Size- G/6 (4.25 mm)

Gauge (stitches and rows in 4")- 20 sc & 20 rows = 4"

5 sc & 5 rows= 1"

Abbreviations used in the pattern- Ch- chain; Sc- single crochet; Dc- double crochet, sc2tog- single crochet two together

Other Materials needed

¼ yard colour appropriate fabric lining, tapestry needle, sewing needle, sewing thread, sewing pins

## COMPLETE DIRECTIONS

### TRIANGLE TOP (make two)

Using US G crochet hook, or size needed to obtain gauge, ch 32.

Row 1- Dc in 3rd chain from hook, dc in next ch, \*ch2, skip next two ch sts, 1 dc in next 2 ch sts, repeat from \* to end of row. Ch 1.

Row 2- Turn work 90 degrees, \*insert hook into space between first two dc stitches, work 5 dc stitches into this space, ch 1, turn work 180 degrees, insert hook into space between first two dc stitches, work 5 dc stitches into this space, {first scale made}, skip the 2-dc group, turn work 180 degrees, repeat from \* to end of row, ch 2, turn work over. {5 scales made}

Row 3- \*2 dc into centre of last scale made, ch 2, 2 dc into space between skipped 2-dc group from row below, ch 2, repeat from \* to end of row. Ch 1, turn work over.

Row 4- Turn work 90 degrees, \* skip the next 2-dc group, insert hook into space between second set of two dc stitches, work 5 dc stitches into this space, ch 1, turn work 180 degrees, insert hook into space between first two dc stitches, work 5 dc stitches into this space, {first scale made}, turn work 180

degrees, repeat from \* to end of row, ch 2, turn work over. {4 scales made}

Row 5- Skip centre of last scale made, \*2 dc into space between skipped 2-dc group from row below, ch 2, 2 dc in centre of next scale, ch 2, repeat to second to last scale, 2 dc into space between last skipped 2-dc group from row below.

Row 6- Repeat row 4. {3 scales made}

Row 7- 2 dc into centre of last scale made in Row 4, ch 2, \*2 dc into space between skipped 2-dc group from the row below, ch 2, 2 dc into centre of last scale made in Row 6, repeat from \* until centre of last scale made in Row 6, 2 dc into centre of this scale, ch 2, 2 dc into centre of first scale made in Row 4.

Row 8- Repeat Row 2. {4 scales made}

Repeat Rows 3- 8 once more; Repeat Rows 3-6 once more.

Row 9- Repeat Row 5.

Row 10- Repeat Row 4. {3 scales made}

Row 11- Repeat Row 7.

Row 12- Repeat Row 2. {two scales made}

Repeat Rows 9- 12 once more.

Row 13- 2 dc into space between skipped 2-dc group from row below.

Row 14- Turn work 90 degrees, \*insert hook into space between first two dc stitches, work 5 dc stitches into this space, ch 1, turn work 180 degrees, insert hook into space between first two dc stitches, work 5 dc stitches into this space. {one scale made} Cut yarn and fasten off.

## BOTTOM STRAP

Using US G crochet hook, or size needed to obtain gauge, ch 4, turn. Starting with second ch from hook, 1 sc in each ch. (3 sts) Turn.

Row 1- 1 sc in each sc, turn.

Repeat Row 1 until piece measures approx. 16" from initial row.

Increase Row- 2 sc in the 1st sc, 1 sc into next sc, 2 sc in the last sc. (5 sts)

Repeat Row 1 until piece measures approx. 13" from Increase Row.

Decrease Row- sc2tog, 1 sc in next sc, sc2tog. (3 sts)

Repeat Row 1 until piece measures approx. 13" from Decrease Row. Cut yarn and fasten off.

## TOP STRAPS (make two)

Using US G crochet hook, or size needed to obtain gauge, ch 4, turn. Starting with second ch from hook, 1 sc in each ch. (3 sts)

Row1- 1 sc in each sc, turn.

Repeat Row 1 until piece measures approx. 18" from initial row. Cut yarn and fasten off.

## FINISHING

Lining-

Create a parabola with a base approx. 7" wide and a height of approx. 7". Trace onto lining fabric and cut out, twice. Press sides under, creating a 1/4" seam around the entire shape. Using sewing pins, pin into place onto the WS the Triangle Top piece with RS of fabric facing outward. Using a sewing needle and sewing thread, whip stitch along the entire edge of the lining, attaching it to the back of the Triangle top piece. Cut thread. Repeat on second Triangle Top piece.

Using the tapestry needle, and extra yarn, attach both Triangle Tops to the Bottom Strap along their bottom edge {edge with 5 scales} so that each outside corner of the Triangle Tops begins at the Increase/Decrease (respectively) Rows of the Bottom Strap.

Using the tapestry needle, and extra yarn, attach one Top Strap to the a Triangle Top piece so that it's

vertical edge is centred in the single scale made on the final row of the Triangle Top piece. Repeat on second Triangle Top piece.

Weave in all loose ends. Bikini is secured by tying the straps into a simple secure knot.
